

Being that we were in the traffic pattern we executed a power off 180 just like in every students commercial pilot training. There were two aircraft ahead of us. On base and final. I told them to go around as we needed to land immediately. We landed safely and were able to clear the runway.

continued to cycle the alternator and then it kicked in and the battery started charging and addios came back. I grounded the plane and scheduled a repair with the

maintenance shop. Although it didn't turn into an emergency, it was a valuable lesson to include the alternator indicator into my scan and also to keep a handheld radio on board as back up so decrease the level of risk, should this happen in the future with the alternator not coming back online.
